Vancouver International Piano Competition



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Introduction to the Competition

The Vancouver International Piano Competition is organized by the Beijing Youth Art Development Special Fund, authorized by the Canadian Pianists Association, with support from the Beijing Runhe Public Welfare Foundation, and managed by Squirrel Muse (Beijing) Cultural Co., Ltd. The competition invites authoritative piano professors from top music institutions both domestically and internationally, as well as renowned international piano performers, to form the judging panel. Through high-level piano competitions and rich academic exchange activities, the competition aims to provide a platform for young piano enthusiasts to showcase their talents, engage in mutual exchange, enrich their knowledge, and broaden their horizons.

During the China regional finals, many professors from the judging panel will personally participate in various academic exchange activities, including master classes, public classes, learning exchanges, concerts, etc. This allows the participants to closely interact with well-known pianists, continuously improve their piano performance skills, enhance their artistic literacy, and plan the development path of their performances. Simultaneously, the competition is committed to discovering and nurturing cutting-edge piano artistic talents, providing them with opportunities to realize their dreams and embark on the artistic journey towards the international stage.

Competition video recording standards

- (1) Please use the camera or the recording function on your mobile phone to shoot a horizontal video. Fix the camera on the right-hand side of the performer to ensure the entire body and clear facial and hand movements are visible in the frame.
- (2) The competition video recording should be continuous and unedited. If an external recording device is used, ensure that the audio and video are synchronized.
- (3) During the recording, the participant should perform directly without displaying any personal names, affiliations, or information about instructors that may affect the fairness of the competition.

- (4) The video should have a resolution of 1080P or higher and be in MP4 or MOV format. The video file size should not exceed 2GB.
- (5) The submitted performance must have been recorded within the six months prior to the registration deadline.

Registration Guidelines for the International Grand Finals and Music Festival:

1.Registration Period:

- (1) Music Festival (free participation in the International Grand Finals after qualifying): From now until May 31st, 2024
- •(2) Registration for the International Grand Finals only: May 15th, 2024, to May 31st, 2024, Participants who have won the second prize or above in the U.S. division are eligible to register for the International Grand Finals.
- •Note: Students who did not qualify or did not participate in the competition can still register for the Music Festival. Participants who qualify for the International Grand Finals through the Music Festival are eligible for free participation.
